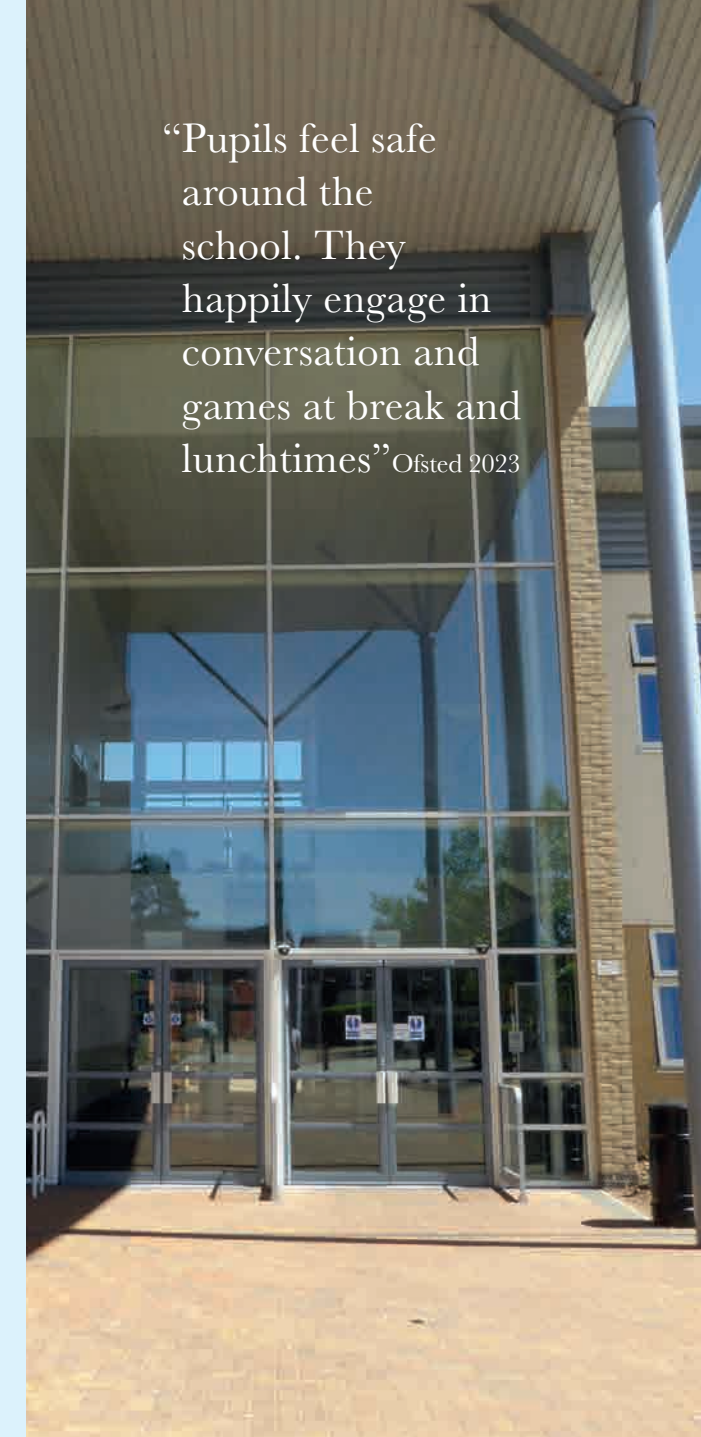

# Learning & Teaching

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**A broad, balanced and relevant curriculum, centred on the core subjects of English, Maths and Science, is at the heart of our provision. We ensure students have access to a full range of skills, knowledge and opportunities to maximise success and to prepare them for their future.**

A strong focus on literacy, numeracy and ICT throughout the curriculum embeds essential skills for life and is one of the factors that leads to the high rate of exam success, well above the national average.

The curriculum is rigorous and enables students, from Year 7, to study recognised academic subjects that will support them to advance in their learning; we also ensure students learn the skills of problem solving, critical thinking and creativity which employers are so keen to have in their

businesses of the future. As well as the traditional exam subjects we are able to offer a broad range of subjects at GCSE and A-level including Business Studies, Economics, Engineering, Child Development, Classics, French, German, Spanish and Sound Engineering.

Students are actively encouraged to take responsibility for their own learning, to be resilient, resourceful and ambitious. This is also true of our teachers who are encouraged to develop their practice, to provide a learning environment that is interactive, vibrant and enjoyable. The staff engage in action research to enhance their practice and we consistently review all elements of our teaching to ensure we can deliver the highest quality classroom experience for all our students.

Our activities outside the classroom are also vital for enriching the students' educational experience.

Taverham High School students are renowned for their spirit, energy and enthusiasm. With a wide range of opportunities for fun, challenge and experiences beyond the curriculum, our committed and enthusiastic staff help to enhance our students learning. We are proud of our sense of community and students are encouraged to take responsibility, to consider others and work together as a team. Opportunities include: sport, music, clubs and societies, Gold, Silver & Bronze Duke of Edinburgh, trips & visits, links with universities including Oxford & Cambridge, Nelsonspirit, Norwich School, guest speakers, Young Enterprise, as well as links with the business community. The school encourages students to support the local community and various charities and we are particularly proud of the money raised during RAGFEST week which is organised by our sixth form students but in which all take part.

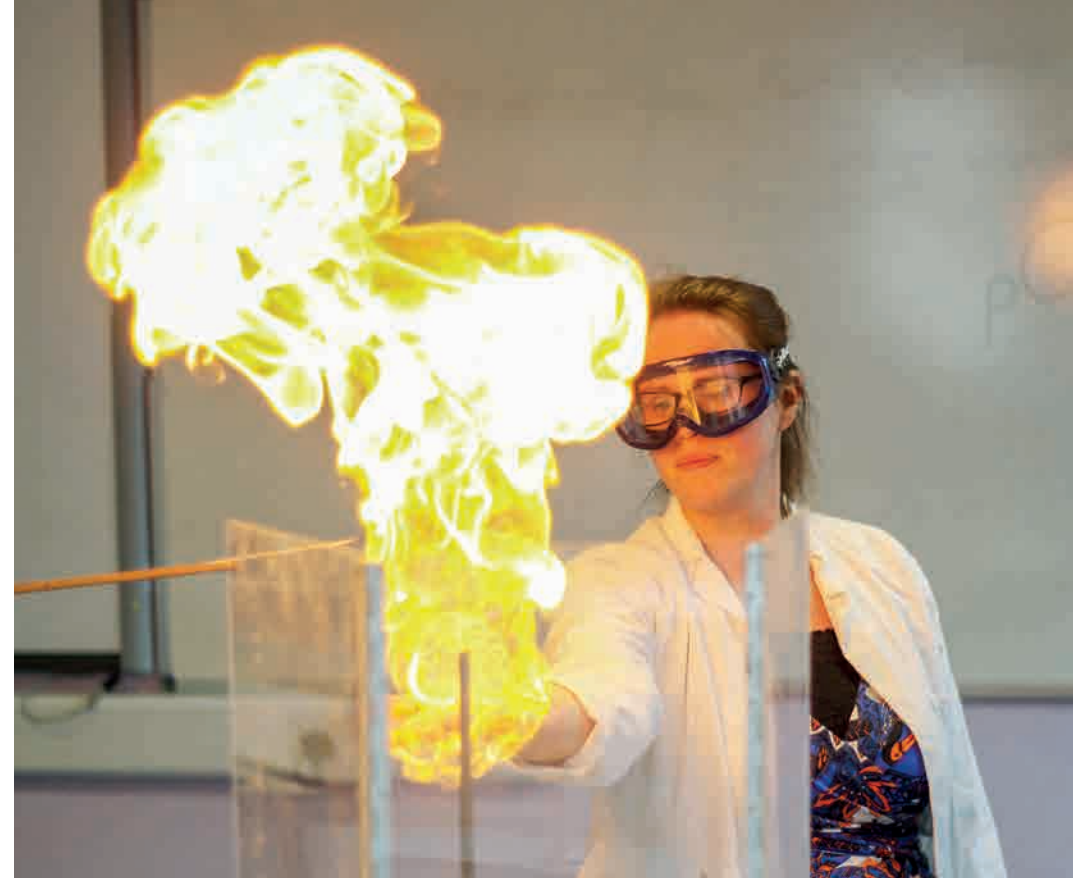
# Celebrating Success

# Pastoral & Support

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**The behaviour of students and pastoral care at Taverham High School has been regarded as excellent for a number of years. We have a strong pastoral system and a rigorous behaviour policy which results in students feeling safe and focussed on their learning.**

The students respect and care for each other and the local community, and we are often congratulated on the fact that they make fine ambassadors when we have visitors or take the students out on educational trips.

The pastoral team has overall responsibility to ensure that every student meets their academic potential and are supported during their time at Taverham. The first port of call is the Form Tutor who is responsible for students on a day to day basis. Students meet for registration in tutor groups twice a day and Form Tutors are always happy to resolve issues or difficulties. Form Tutors traditionally follow the students through the main school so that an excellent relationship is established; they know the students very well and how to best support them. When the students go into the Sixth form we have a specialist team of tutors who are experienced and provide that essential guidance required to develop the skills required for independent study, moving onto university, apprenticeships or other forms of education or training.

## **Student Support Centre**

Within the Student Support Centre our aim is to offer young people a safe environment where they feel supported to work through challenges they may face, allowing them to achieve their full potential during their time at Taverham High School. Working within in student support we have a team of staff, who will be able to work through issues such as behavioural problems, family trauma, bullying and crisis situations. We offer supported integration back into school for students who have been away for a long period of time through illness, bereavement etc. Our aim is to work with students, parents, carers and support workers, offering a package which will include signposting to appropriate external agencies.

## **ELF – Everyone’s Listening Friend**

The ELF team is a group of year 10 peer support students who are selected and trained to listen. The role of the ELF is to support, listen and encourage positive relationships and social interactions between younger students in school. The ELFs work closely with the year 7 students during their transition so they have an older friendly face they can rely on during those first few days or weeks whilst they are settling into this new environment.

## **Transition**

The transition process at Taverham High School is meticulously planned to ensure your child has

the best possible transfer to high school. We work with our feeder schools to ensure we have all the information required to get to know your child well and to support their learning from day one. During the main transition days, we will ensure the year 6 students will meet their Form Tutor, year 10 peer supporters (ELFs) and the other students in their form, that they have a tour of the school and experience typical lessons. We have introduced an afternoon before this day for any out of catchment students, so they can meet others in their position and make some friends before they arrive.

We also offer two other mornings for students who are worried or anxious about the transition to high school or have any Special Educational Needs. We are confident that these extra visits help us to get to know our new students well and enable us to prepare effectively for their arrival.

As a final element of the transition process we have a parents’ evening in order that students and parents and carers can meet with Form Tutors and have informal conversations about any concerns or worries they may have. This is then followed by a more formal assembly involving the Headteacher, the Head of Year 7 and some of Taverham High School’s own students. We constantly review our processes and tailor our programme to the needs of individuals if there are specific requirements.

## SEND at Taverham High School

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At Taverham High School we believe in inclusion and participation for all. It is our aim to promote learning through nurturing the whole child, developing self-esteem and establishing the emotional stability of all students and especially those who are vulnerable. We aim to proactively respond to the diversity of students' backgrounds, interests, experience, knowledge and skills.

Every learner is considered an individual and we work hard to ensure that each one can play a full and active part in school life; achieving the highest academic progress possible whatever their starting point.

Students with special educational needs and disabilities are supported by a strong team of learning support assistants and teachers to enable them to fully access the curriculum available to all students.

SEND provision is tailored to meet learners' individual needs and is planned and delivered with agreement of learners and their parents/carers. It may consist of individual or small group support within or outside the classroom. Provision that is

organised outside the classroom is intended to develop vital core learning skills that are required to facilitate further learning such as maths, literacy and readiness to learn. This is delivered in a way that reduces the impact on other subjects.

During breaks and lunchtimes students who are particularly vulnerable have access to additional facilities that allow them to feel secure and develop confidence in a smaller social setting.

In 2018-2019 we were delighted to add sensory and nurture facilities to our provision. These are environments specifically designed to meet the needs of students that may find elements of the physical or social environment difficult to manage. Through the nurture room we offer small group

structured activities throughout the day in a relaxed and comfortable environment. Nurture activities are designed with nurture principles at the heart and which support the development of skills for learning in addition to providing a safe base for learners to develop stress regulation skills.

Programmes and short projects are delivered to address social and emotional difficulties such as safe behaviour choices, relationships and belonging. The sensory space (room) offers a small environment where students can use bespoke sensory stimulation to calm and regulate their emotions to become ready to re-enter the learning environment.

# The Library

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**The library is at the heart of the school offering our students a wide range of opportunities.**

Our role encompasses supporting and promoting reading for pleasure for all abilities and providing outstanding facilities and resources for study, as well as encouraging our students to be inspired by the magic of words. Students can borrow 2 books at any given time, including over the Summer break. Activities range from writing workshops to competitions, quizzes and visits by authors.

Additional activities throughout the school year include the Carnegie Medal Award, the celebration of National Poetry Day, Book Week and World Book Day. A number of clubs take place in the library including Chess club and PRIDE group. There are a number of reading interventions offered in the Library, and student progress is regularly celebrated.

Students can access our library catalogue, both at school and at home, through our online library management system, AccessIT.

## Future Pathways

We are committed to ensuring that all our students have high aspirations for their future and are fully prepared for the competitive world of work. This enables our students to secure a career that is both stimulating and rewarding. Students in all key stages engage in a rich programme of personal development and guidance and we are committed to providing impartial careers advice and guidance for all of our students.

## Sixth Form

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**At Taverham Sixth Form our philosophy is to get the very best out of every student and support them to reach their full potential. Building excellent relationships between students and staff is a core value. These relationships ensure that we personalise the Sixth Form experience and get the most out of every individual. We are the perfect size to offer a wide range of courses whilst still ensuring we tailor our provision closely to students' needs.**

Taverham Sixth Form is an inspiring and exciting place of further study. We provide a learning environment of high expectations and challenge which focuses on preparing students from across Norwich for the opportunities offered in higher education, employment and training. Students choose to study with us because, as Ofsted noted in 2023, 'Sixth-form students benefit from teaching that is closely tailored to their needs,' and the fact that 'teachers provide tailored and individualised guidance that support sixth-form students to achieve well.' New students settle quickly into the community.

At Taverham we do everything we can to help students raise and realise their aspirations. We participate in the Norfolk Higher Education Scheme and work closely with Norwich School. Visits to the University of East Anglia, the University of Suffolk and Cambridge help to broaden horizons; strong links with local universities and participation in their outreach programmes

offer early experiences of university life. We offer carefully tailored support for the UCAS application process. For the last few years, our students have been offered places to read at Oxford and Cambridge. In 2024, 76% of our students applied to university. We identify those who choose to go into employment and apprenticeships as early as possible and offer them mentoring through our careers service. We have Mindset sessions and assemblies which provide students with information regarding this route. Our Future Pathways events include workshops led by employers alongside a careers fair.

We have an inclusive and holistic ethos that runs alongside our good track record of examination results. We have developed a tutor programme that equips students with the skills and attitudes required for success, fostering an A-level mind-set and cultural capital. Alongside this the tutor programme includes a well-being element that seeks to provide practical methods for avoiding stress, developing resilience and living a fulfilling life. Character and Culture lessons also equip students with the tools and skills to become active citizens, covering a range of topics from health and wellbeing through to personal finance.

As part of the enrichment programme students can participate in sport as well as assisting in lessons and representing the school in Sixth Form teams. The programme also involves a range of life skills

from cooking to financial trading. In our Open Minds sessions, we host visiting academics from top institutions whose lectures are then followed up by discussion forums for students. We have a fully supported programme for the Extended Project Qualification that enables students to pursue their own academic interests. Work experience is built into the academic calendar in Year 12, and we have developed a number of unique partnerships with businesses, some of which offer opportunities to work overseas. The enrichment programme gives students a competitive edge in their applications to university or employment.

The sense of community at Taverham Sixth Form is epitomised by the annual RAGFEST. Sixth formers take a leading role in this fundraising week, which in 2024 raised a staggering £4078 for St Martins. We have an active Sixth Form Committee comprised of our sixth form leaders: Heads of School, Deputy Heads of School, leaders representing each academic faculty and school community leaders. Our sixth form leaders work closely with the main school council to create a cohesive school community. We encourage volunteering in the community and aim to develop ties between the school and the surrounding area.

Finally, we have created a dedicated Sixth Form Centre at the heart of the school. This is equipped with fantastic bespoke facilities for Sixth Formers to study, collaborate and socialise.

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
