Re: End of Year 10

The expectations are as follows for September and moving forward:

SCHOOL UNIFORM

• Trousers

Should be plain black, tailored trousers. They may be slim fit, if this is a preference, but must not be leggings. They cannot be jeans, track suit bottoms, have studded pockets or be 'figure hugging'. Please be aware that some shops are pushing legging style trousers with pockets and classifying these as school trousers. They are not acceptable in our school.

• Shoes

Must be plain black and polishable. If you are not sure, please ask.



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• Piercings

must be simple studs (students wearing hoops, or any other type of piercing will be asked to remove them). Additionally, all students must be able to take part in the full curriculum. This means that, for example, piercings must be removeable for PE lessons. Please therefore ensure that your child/ward only has piercings at times when there is enough healing time so they can be taken out for lessons. This is likely to be the start of the Summer holiday.

• Hoodies

These are not acceptable items of outerwear in our school. Please support us by ensuring your child/ward has an appropriate coat if they are cold. Do not let them come to school in a hoodie.

If, for whatever reason, your child/ward does not have the proper uniform, please ensure they have a signed note explaining why and when this will be corrected. Any exceptions will not be accepted for longer than one week.

If your child/ward has a permanent exemption, it would be really helpful if this was accompanied by medical evidence. However, if this is not possible, please contact me in the first week of term to discuss this and your child/ward may be issued with an exception card which they should expect to politely produce each time they are questioned about their uniform. This applies to toilet cards as well, although these will all need medical evidence to support them. If your child/ward comes to school in September in the incorrect uniform and without a note, they may be sent home again until they return in the correct uniform, please support us and them by ensuring that this isn't necessary.

Please know that your child/ward is at the very forefront of our thinking, and we will do everything we can to get them over the last hurdle!
