Finally, I wanted to make you aware of a fantastic opportunity that several of our year 8s engaged with at the end of the summer term, in July. Our students entered a competition to place an item into a time capsule to be sealed into the walls of Norwich Castle, as part of their multi-million pound redevelopment project. The competition, judged by members of the castle's redevelopment team, asked for items to be no bigger that the size of an egg and to best represent "life in Norwich in 2024". The items also had to be made of a material that would last a long time for future generations to get a glimpse into their past. Our students came up with some excellent ideas, such as technology, precious stones and charity. However, the winning entry was provided by Henry S who impressed the judges with his creation of a bracelet that represented a popular trend from this time period, and in the colours made famous by Norwich City Football Club. His item will join other contributions from different people of different ages across Norwich and be sealed into the very walls of Norwich Castle. Who knows what future generations will think – but well done to Henry for leaving his mark on history!
