

Chris Page - Geography talk

On Tuesday the Geography department had a guest speaker in to talk to the A level geographers (and some lucky Year II's). Chris Page is a meteorologist and weather presenter for ITV focussing on the Anglia region and came in to talk to students about university and careers utilising Geography, and the benefits of the subject to future employers.

Chris discussed Climate Change in his talk, a key concept in the Geography curriculum at THS. It features prominently in topics like 'Water and Carbon' at A Level and 'The Challenge of Natural Hazards' at GCSE, while also underpinning the entire curriculum and shaping our future. Chris' talk reinforced many of the ideas we discuss such as management and mitigation of climate change. As well as ideas surrounding feedback loops and impacts of climate change at a variety of scales. Students found the talk really insightful as well as getting to talk to someone who makes real predictions about the weather and has used his Physical Geography degree to forge a career. We really enjoyed welcoming someone of local fame into the department and hopefully Chris will come back and talk to us again in the future.

Lego Therapy

For the last three weeks students working in Lego Therapy sessions have been designing games made with Lego. They had to work collaboratively to design the game concept, rules and objective. WHAT'S HAPPENING IN...

Art

Last week, Year 11 Art students completed their final coursework piece over a two-day exam. Sixth Form students completed their three-day exam for their coursework outcomes. There were some fantastic outcomes and we are looking forward to the final outcomes at the end of the year and another amazing exhibition. Recently, Sixth Form students were given the opportunity to take part in a life modelling enrichment session. The students gained a lot from the experience, and this will help support their progress as artists.

Design & Technology

In Design & Technology, we are nearing the end of the second rotation of projects in KS3, students have been very creative with their design and practical work. Hopefully, they will be taking their completed projects home to share, it is great to think that what they make in school can be used to start discussions about the subject and the learning that's been taking place. Year II and 13s are well into their NEA (non-exam assessment, or coursework) and they will be starting to manufacture their final designs soon after the Christmas break. For GCSE students, the department offers additional after school sessions on a weekly basis: Wednesdays for D&T, and Thursdays for Engineering. We encourage all students to attend and hope they take advantage of the opportunities available to achieve the best they can. With Year 9 choosing their options soon, students are encouraged to talk to their subject teachers in lessons to find out about all the different subjects the Design & Technology department offers.

Food club will continue after Christmas on selected dates. Students can sign up for these sessions via Wisepay with a £1 contribution towards the cost of ingredients. The sessions that have run so far have proved very popular with students making all sorts of yummy goodies!

Drama

Miss Andrews and a group of Year 7 students have spent several weeks rehearsing and preparing for a performance of Ernie's Incredible Illucinations. The students have been working really hard to prepare for their performance today, and we wish both cast and support the best of luck for today. Stage Door drama club has welcomed an influx of new members, and they are currently working on "Scenes From The Musicals" in readiness for the Spring Concert. It is not too late to join them, they meet in the studio on Friday lunch times. Year 10 are busy rehearsing for next term's production of Twelfth Night, which will be followed by an abridged performance of Blood Brothers scheduled for the end of the summer term.

Meanwhile, Year 11 are preparing for their practical GCSE exam. As part of their written exam, they are required to review a live production and we are eagerly anticipating the forthcoming trip, more details will be available soon!

Music

Year 7 students have completed their Wallace & Gromit performance and will now learn how chords create harmony and support melodies. They're exploring chord construction, identifying major and minor tonalities, and using chord sequences to enhance texture in their music. In Year 8, the focus has been What Makes a Good Song? Students have explored catchy melodies, hooks, riffs, and song structures like verses, choruses, and bridges, analysing how lyrics interact with music. Year 9 students have worked on music with repeated patterns, such as hooks and riffs, performing pieces like Uptown Funk, Shape of You, and Seven Years. They've been assessed and taken part in peer feedback.

In Year 10, students have performed solo pieces to prepare for their performance assessment, practising regularly and updating their performance logs. In the new year, they'll start Conventions of Pop, studying popular music from the 1950s to today. For Year 11 the focus has been on the Development of the Concerto (1650–1910), solo and ensemble performances, and refining compositions for final assessments. Year 12 Music Technology students have been mastering digital audio workstations (DAWs) and honing skills for creative projects. Year 13 students have been learning mixing and mastering techniques by remixing the multitrack of Bohemian Rhapsody. They're also producing the Christmas track. Mr Yassin showed everyone how it is done!



PE

There have been a lot of extra-curricular clubs and sports activities this term, including the popular Fitness Friday activities. This term has seen another group of students successfully complete their Couch-to-5K challenge. Students took part in the park run at Sloughbottom Park in Norwich recently. Well done to all who took part.

Congratulations to James L, who has been competing in the Norfolk Sportshall athletics league competition. The league consisted of three matches and James has won the All Rounder Champion for 2024. In January he will be competing in the County Championships and hopefully the regional finals. We wish him good luck in the championships and for his future in athletics.
