We had lots of students compete in the Bebras computational thinking and problem-solving competition this year, it is a world-wide competition, with over 80 countries taking part. There were a range of suitable for all questions that utilised different skills sets.

Our Juniors (Year 7) did a great job, with the average score of those at Taverham higher than the rest of Norfolk. Our Inters (Years 8 and 9) averaged significantly higher than the rest of the country - well done you bright bunch!

All those that entered will receive a certificate in the new year - everyone gets a participation award, the top 25% of our school got a gold certificate and the next 25% got a merit award. The top 10% of the country got a gold award - these have been given out in the end of term assembly, and this year we had 37 students in the top 10%, in the past the most we have had is 7.

Computing

History

On Friday 13th December we were involved in an online lecture and Q and A from the British Library, led by historian and writer Janina Ramirez. This was part of the British Library's "Medieval Women: In Their Own Words" exhibit that runs until March 2025. 35 students from Years 7-9 joined the session from Taverham High School and were able to find out more about the lives of influential medieval women as well as submit questions for Professor Ramirez to answer as part of a live interview after she had concluded her talk. 
