WHAT'S HAPPENING IN...

2025 is an exciting year mathematically – as 2025 itself is a square number – 45×45 . This is the first time this has happened since 1936 and it will not happen again until 2116! When you consider that 45 is the sum of 20 and 25 – that just adds to interest. 2025 is also the sum of the cubes of all the single digits, so $1^3 + 2^3 + 3^3 + 4^3 + 5^3 + 6^3 + 7^3 + 8^3 + 9^3 = 2025$. The maths department at Taverham High School can't help but enjoy some of these facts and love to share them with our students and of course with you, our wider school community!

Within the department, we are excited to announce that 2025 has seen the arrival of Pieces of Pi. Students will have slips with ten 'pieces of Pi' stuck into the back of their exercise books. They will be given a piece of pi in recognition of any small actions or efforts that are noted by their teachers during lessons, which they record on their slip. Perhaps they completed a task well, answered a question, asked for help, were supportive of another student. These are additional opportunities for recognition of the everyday positive actions that so many students demonstrate routinely. Students can collect their pieces of pi to gain extra house points.

At the end of last term we said a sad farewell to Dr Stangoe, who has been a longstanding member of the maths department here at Taverham but has decided it is time to celebrate her retirement. However, it was not quite goodbye, as she has stayed with us part time to support with the transition period. This has meant some changes to the timetable and we have been very proud of all students affected, who have adapted well to their new timetables, dealing with changes to staffing and rooming arrangements. We are grateful to parents and carers for their ongoing support.

Over the last year we have built some positive links with the local community and it will be exciting to see what ideas our students have come up with to work with the charity this year.

Assemblies this week have been on the power of the internet and social media, so it seems like a good opportunity to flag up the importance of us, as parents/carers, being proactive in checking our child's phones and devices, making sure that we know what content they are looking at and accessing, and that settings on devices are up to date.
