

Design & Technology

KS3 students are now onto their third rotation of the year. Some excellent work is being produced with students enthusiastically engaging with their projects. In case you missed Year 9 options evening last week, your child's subject teacher has delivered a short presentation about the subjects the department offers at KS4. Staff are always on hand to answer any questions that students may have about options. A reminder that we offer GCSEs in Design & Technology and Engineering, a vocational qualification in Hospitality and Catering, and also Level 1 BTEC Construction.

Year 11 and 13 students are nearing completion of their coursework projects with practical work underway in most groups. The deadline for GCSE Engineering and Design & Technology coursework is 14th March, and for A level it is 4th April.

The Hospitality students have had a demanding week with their practical food exam. Students have worked really hard in preparing recipes and time plans prior to the exam. There were some amazing plates of food produced. Well done everyone!

Keep your eyes peeled for details of the annual Bake Off coming soon in March. Students will have to find a teacher to pair with to compete and spaces are limited. Letters will be sent home shortly after half term about this. Also look out for food club next half term. To take part in this a small donation towards ingredients is required via Wisepay. With the weather hopefully getting a bit warmer soon, gardening club will be back up and running in time for spring planting. Look out for messages at morning registration about this.

Drama

We've been working on Pantomime recently, discovering the key elements, exploring them practically and creating clownish characters and stories. These are snippets of a research booklet which supports their independent skills and work. We're really proud of what they've accomplished!

Music

In Key Stage 3, Year 7 students are preparing for their performance assessment on Beethoven's "Ode to Joy," focusing on chords, harmony, and building confidence in keyboard and ensemble skills. Year 8 students are exploring "What Makes a Good Song?" by analyzing catchy melodies, hooks, riffs, and song structures, and examining how lyrics convey emotions. Year 9 students, after studying cyclic patterns and minimalist music, are now exploring The Blues, including the 12-bar blues structure and composing blues-inspired pieces.

In Key Stage 4, Year 10 students are preparing for solo performance assessments and studying the Conventions of Pop, focusing on popular music's evolution from the 1950s to the present. Year 11 students are refining solo and ensemble performances, developing compositions, and studying Rhythms of the World to understand global music styles and techniques.

In Key Stage 5, Year 12 Music Technology students are mastering digital audio workstations (DAWs) and have recently completed a 15-hour mock exam, producing music for an art installation. Year 13 students are focusing on advanced mixing and mastering techniques, remixing "Steady as She Goes" to develop their technical and creative abilities.

We offer Peripatetic Music Lessons in piano/keyboard, vocals, drums, guitar, flute, and saxophone. Our dedicated peripatetic teaching team greatly enhances our music provision. For lesson inquiries or instrument purchase advice (we often arrange discounts!), please contact Mr. Timbers.

Physical Education

Both our Year 7 and 8 boys football teams made it through to the next stage of their cup competitions. Year 8s won 7-3 and Year 7s drew 1-1 and went through 5-4 on penalties. Well done to Year 11 GCSE PE students who had practical exams this week, starting with Athletics at the UEA, followed by Dance, Football, Table Tennis, Trampolining, Basketball and Hockey. Well done to Oliver in Y9, who has qualified for regional cross-country championships.
