WHAT'S HAPPENING IN...

Computing

It has been a busy few weeks in Computing, KS3 students are sitting their second assessment in the upcoming weeks - revision resources and dates are on Satchel One. KS4 students are sitting their mocks, we have been impressed with their dedication to revision and learning. There is an exciting competition taking place at the end of March, for all KS3 students - Bebras programming competition in either block or Python. Students have been asked to sign up to get practice resources, if they are interested they should email Mrs Moore at d.moore@taverhamhigh.org as soon as possible.

Geography

On Tuesday the geography department took both the Year 12 and Year 13 A Level classes to London, to look at Stratford and the regeneration of the East Village. As part of the A Level course we look at topics called 'Changing Places' and 'Contemporary Urban Environments' which look at the legacy of redevelopment and how people perceive these changes.

The aim of the fieldwork was for students to decide if the redevelopment in preparation for the 2012 Olympics has had a positive impact on the area. They took into account social, economic and environmental data by completing perception studies, environmental quality surveys and using secondary census data in numerous areas in Stratford, including the former Olympic Village and outside West Ham Football ground.

When back in class students will statistically analyse the data to draw conclusions that they can use within both their coursework and in exams. It was a positive experience for students to see a case study taught in class in reality, and for once the weather held up!!







History

On Tuesday 25th February, 19 A Level History students visited the Tower of London to develop their understanding of the events of "The Mid-Tudor Crisis" as part of their Tudor History course. At the Tower our students were met by one of the Tower's education team who provided them with insight about the history of the Tower, and the role it played in enforcing the rule of Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary I and Elizabeth I during a time of significant political and religious turmoil, as well as a tour of some of the key sites within the Tower linked to this. They then had time for a spot of lunch as well as a little bit of free time to visit other areas of the Tower and see the Crown Jewels. It was a really successful and useful experience of our Year 12 and 13 students and certainly added another dimension to their learning outside of the classroom.

Modern Foreign Languages

At the end of last term, Year 9 were working on a cross-curricular Art and German project. They were learning about a famous early 20th century German expressionist art movement known as 'The Blue Riders.' Famous painters included Wassily Kandinsky and Franz Marc. The artists were known to use bright colours and animal subjects in their work.

Students described their work in German, in the style of GCSE picture cards – describing their chosen animal, its location and action as shown in their artwork. Students enjoyed this project and were really proud of their work, now on display in Ms Havunen's classroom.

Welcome back! I hope everyone enjoyed a restful and relaxing half term break and returned to us refreshed and ready to learn. As ever, it was lovely to see the masses swarming in again on Monday morning! And, as ever, they've made a brilliant start back in lessons, full of energy and interest.

Year 11s have been involved with their second round of mock exams this week, starting with English, Maths and History in the hall, then into classrooms over the next couple of weeks for other subjects. With only one or two exceptions they've worked sensibly and taken these exams seriously. This will give them and their teachers an accurate reflection of where they are at and where their gaps are and, of course, this is the purpose of these exams. Good luck to all for the next few weeks – keep working hard.

We've already had trips to London this week for our A-level artists who visited an exhibition, our historians, who visited the Tower of London for a specially designed seminar, and our geographers who carried out primary research and made observations on how Stratford has been regenerated over time. Thank you to colleagues and families who supported these trips – they couldn't happen without you. We've had feedback from a few families this week about the timings of communications around accessing trips and ensuring that all can access them. While this is really difficult sometimes and we are keen to offer as many extracurricular opportunities as possible (even if that means a few students miss out), there are certainly a number of things we could improve within this, so thank you for your feedback and we'll continue to try to make those improvements.

Before the half term break I recorded a message to all students to remind them of my expectations regarding uniform. Brilliantly almost all students have responded positively to this message and are doing the right thing. Please could I emphasise one more time that tracksuit bottoms are not part of our school uniform and students coming to school in those can expect to spend their lunch break in detention. They've been spoken to individually, but I would be grateful for your support with this.

Finally, a really special mention for all the performers and technical crew who made last night's Spring Concert such a success. A full hall, incredible dancers, talented musicians and singers who filled our school with joy. It was a real pleasure to spend the evening watching them and my thanks to Mr Timbers, Miss Norman, Mrs Richardson, Miss Sayer, Mrs Crane, Miss Heydon and Miss Cook for making the evening such a success.
