The Year 12 tutoring program started this Monday which is where 75 Year 11 students are tutored by one of our 18 Year 12 tutors in a particular subject area. Our Year 12 volunteers received training by Miss Green on how to be an effective tutor and it has been great to see some of these sessions in action. Not only does it demonstrate our core value of compassion, but it also provides students with the opportunity to develop their communication, interpersonal and leadership skills.

On Wednesday, Miss Green also organised a Year 12 Sociology visit to Norwich Whitefriars Court to participate in a courtroom workshop. This was an amazing opportunity for the students to see a real working courtroom and take part in a mock trial, where they had the opportunity to be the judge, barristers, witnesses, clerk, usher and jury members. Upon returning to Sixth Form, the students animatedly told me how accurate their verdict was compared to the real verdict so well done to everyone involved and thank you to Miss Green for providing this opportunity for our students.

#### AND FINALLY...

And in the blink of an eye, we've approached the halfway point of the half term – Easter looms, then it's only a few short weeks before the exams start! We've started putting together a programme for students to opt into in school over the Easter break to support their revision, subject leaders will be writing home to make sure you're aware of what's on offer. These sessions will take place on Monday 7th and Monday 14th April so, if you can, please try to keep these days clear for students in Years 11 and 13 so they can access revision sessions should they wish to (or you wish them to!). I have deliberately separated the two in-school revision days by a week in case families are away for one or other week in the hope that all students can access something of use to them.

On Tuesday this week, a group of Year 9 students took a trip out to Taverham Lakes to take part in the River of Hope project as part of the Norfolk and Norwich Arts Festival. They then followed this up with a poetry session in school, which I was lucky enough to hear a small amount of. The poem the artist performed about his father was incredibly moving and beautifully written – I was only sorry I couldn't stay longer. The third part of this project, on Thursday, involved the group creating pieces of art reflecting the experience over the week. A really lovely project and experience for all of those invited to take part. The poet and representative from the festival stopped me on the way out of school to commend our students and tell me how well they represented themselves, their school and their families, so well done to all involved and my thanks to Mrs Adams, Mr Powell and Mrs Summerson–Gray for coordinating the running the project. Getting these sorts of compliments from visitors and the public is starting to become the norm for our students, but it's always welcome!

Also on Thursday, I met with Nigel and Lottie from NelsonSpirit (you can read their annual report at NelsonSpirit\_Annual\_Report\_2024\_25.pdf) along with a small group of talented and ambitious Year 11 students to give them the chance to learn more about the Lord Lieutenant's Future Leaders Crew, a leadership development programme which encourages young people involved to grow as leaders whilst helping others in their community. If these students decide to apply for the programme and are successful, they will join the 'crew' from September whilst studying at our Sixth Form Centre and will receive regular leadership coaching from CEOs and MDs from Norfolk companies who will work with them to develop their skills and experiences in preparation for future leadership roles. Over time we want to be able to offer more of these sorts of ambitious and developmental opportunities to give our students the chance to really shine. We saw this recently with Olivia G in Year 7 winning the Herring Prize, an international writing award organised by the Norwich School that I wrote to families about earlier in the term. Olivia won first prize in the Year 7 and Year 8 category for her piece 'Ballroom Dancing – a social superpower', which the judges described as an "entertaining, witty, fun piece of writing but with a serious social message too". An incredible achievement and I look forward to seeing Olivia receive her award (and the £100 prize!) on the evening of the 28th March at the National Writing Centre in Norwich.

We continue to look for ways in which we can celebrate success and engage with our community more, so if your child/ward does something fantastic, please do let us know by emailing <u>celebrations@taverhamhigh.org</u> and please get in touch with me if you can think of other ways we could get involved with our local community.

Finally, in the spirit of celebration, we are very proud that we will once again be an oversubscribed school in September with our new Year 7 intake. As in Years 8 and 9, we will support local families by agreeing to take more than our agreed pupil admission numbers, but this will still leave a large number of students who have applied to study with us from September disappointed not to be allocated a place at our fantastic school. We are delighted to be the school of choice for so many families, and we take this honour very seriously. Transition information will be coming out to families over the next few weeks and we look forward to meeting our new starters soon!
