TRIPS AND EVENTS

European Day of Languages

Did you know that in the Taverham High School community, we speak over forty languages from five continents around the world?! Could you recognise Chichewa (from Malawi) or Mayalayam (from Southern India), or tell the difference between Arabic from Saudi Arabia and Arabic from Egypt?!

Last Thursday 26th September we celebrated European Day of Languages, with a focus on our fantastic multilingual students and staff, who collaborated to create a quiz that tested our linguistic knowledge. It was fiendish but 11M won by a landslide. Students were also encouraged to share aspects of their home culture and language throughout the day with items from home and by teaching their home language. Here you can see Ms Yaghil with a cricket ball adorned with the Zimbabwean flag, accompanied by a frame showcasing the outline of Zimbabwe. Within the outline, an array of various Zimbabwean coins are displayed – brought in by Dakotah in year 7.









We also held the Eurovision Door Contest – now in its fourth year. Form groups competed to represent a non-English speaking country on their Form room door. The results were incredible, and it was a tough field, but 7S and 7T were joint winners with their depictions of Greece (complete with pillars) and Japan (with handmade cherry blossom!) 10M were the senior winners, depicting Egypt with hand-drawn hieroglyphics and pyramids containing real sand! It was fantastic to see so many countries from around world represented in our corridors.

GCSE Geography Fieldwork Trip

On 26th September GCSE Geography students undertook their final piece of fieldwork, trying to answer the question 'Are the Coastal Defences at West Runton Effective?' which will then be analysed and evaluated before drawing conclusions in our geography lessons.

We collected data on beach profiles looking at the length and gradient of the beach, information about the groynes to show if they are preventing longshore drift and then completed a radar diagram using our own opinions about the rip-rap or rock armour, groynes, sea walls and revetments, scoring them on things such as their state of repair, their attractiveness and how easy they make access to the beach. This information will be further used in GCSE Geography Paper 3 answering exam questions about the methods of data collection, the graphs used to display data and how reliable the conclusions might be, while allowing us to see if the defences are likely to stop the cliffs from being eroded further.





We were incredibly lucky with the weather, with only one short shower while we were having lunch which meant we could hide in the café for 20 minutes and refuel. But overall it was a very successful and enjoyable day and we even managed to spot a fossil or two.

With a new government there is a lot of change in the news that students have been able to link to their studies!

Further, in Economics the year 12s have been looking at the different measures of economic performance and Mr Mayet in particular has really noted the wonderful atmosphere and high levels of engagement from the class in year 12, a very well done for a fantastic start to the A Level course! Year 13 have been looking at the Bank of England and enjoying relating their studies to real life examples.

Business as well has been covering some really interesting topics around leadership in year 12 and in year 13, financial ratios. In Philosophy students have been working hard at GCSE starting well on the topic of relationships and at A Level the classes have been delving into the debate of morality and whether the intention or consequence of an action is more important. In Religious Studies, year 7 have started the Island and are learning each week how to build their community and are discovering different practices along the way.
