WHAT'S HAPPENING IN...

In year 7, students have been learning the basic elements of music. Focusing on keyboard performance, treble clef notation, and melody. They've worked in small ensembles, showing how different musical layers combine to form cohesive pieces.

For year 8, this term's focus has been on popular songs, exploring riffs, lyrics, structure, and melody. Students are performing riffs and improving their ensemble timing.

Year 9 students have been working on repeated patterns like hooks and riffs, performing pieces like "Uptown Funk" and preparing "Shape of You" for assessment.

Year 10 students have deepened their understanding of vocal and instrumental techniques in popular music. They've also started honing performance skills, becoming more confident in ensemble work, and using musical vocabulary.

For year 11, the focus has been on the development of the concerto (1650–1910) and preparing for solo and ensemble performances while refining their compositions in preparation for final assessments.

Year 12 Music Technology students have been mastering the use of digital audio workstations (DAWs), developing the skills needed for creative projects.

In year 13, students are now learning mixing and mastering techniques through remixing the multitrack of "Bohemian Rhapsody." In other news, there's buzz about the Music Technology students producing another Christmas track this year. Could Mr. Yassin be taking on a solo? Stay tuned for the big reveal!
