In Years 10 & 11 you will study: Maths, Science, English Language & Literature at GCSE alongside your GCSE options plus Personal Development, PE and Religious Studies. If you decide to stay on to Sixth Form (Years 12 & 13) you will choose from a range of subjects for your A-Levels.
