DISCOVER PATHWAYS

- **Foundation degree:** flexible vocational qualification, combining both academic study and workplace learning. It usually takes two years to complete.
- **Bachelor's or undergraduate degree:** a three to four-year course which can also be available as a part-time option, allowing you to study and work.
- **Apprenticeships:** typically take between 8 months to 6 years to complete depending on their level. Apprenticeships are offered for levels 2-7 in N.I. and England, levels 2-6 in Wales, and SCQF levels 4-11 in Scotland. All nations offer degree level apprenticeships.

UCAS COURSE SEARCH

CHOICES AND WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- You can make a maximum of **five** choices on your application including:
 - No more than **four** choices to any one of medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine or veterinary science.
 - No more than one course at either Oxford or Cambridge.
- Invisibility of choices
- Choices are not sent in preference order

UCAS FEE AND FSM FEE WAIVER

- The cost to submit your UCAS application for 2027 entry is **£34.50**
 - This single fee allows you to add up to five university and college choices to your application.
- Students who have received UK Government funded free school meals at any point during secondary education may be eligible to have the application fee waived.
 - You have to declare you received FSM in the 'More about you' section of your application
 - FSM is different to the sixth form bursary!
- If you receive the sixth form bursary, this can be used to pay your UCAS application fee.

TYPES OF OFFERS – WHAT DO THEY MEAN

Conditional offer

- The offer has conditions, usually you will need to achieve specified grades or tariff points.

Unconditional offer

- Usually this means you have already met all the entry requirements.

Unsuccessful

- The university has not offered you a place on the course.

Withdrawal

- The application to the course has been withdrawn. Either you withdrew your application, you did not attend the interview or you didn't respond to letters from the university.

You then need to make two decisions:

- 1. Firm choice**
- 2. Insurance choice**

TRACKING YOUR APPLICATION

Follow your application to:

- check progress
- see your choices
- update contact information
- view and reply to your offers

One of three decisions:

- unconditional offer
- conditional offer
- unsuccessful



Submitted to your school or college

Your application has been sent to your school or college and is being checked by your adviser. Once they have approved it your application will be sent to UCAS.
